

It was good to have so many share this day together, but know that all those unable to be there were greatly missed. We hope








Sanctuary Re-Dedication

Mindful Communication: Sometimes it's hard to know how to share ourselves authentically. The Mindful Communication Challenge offers structure to help us improve how we connect with each other. Paying attention to how our words, tone, and actions (even our intentions) affect others, and asking ourselves "Is this true? Kind? Useful?" can help us speak from the heart. These tools help us weed out any thoughts and feelings that are not grounded in reality or love, and also help us dig beneath words to see our common humanity, with our deeper, universal needs.

Since true connection feels heavenly, *Mindful Communication Challenge* is grounded in symbolism from various Parables found in the New Testament that explore "The kingdom of heaven" as well as descriptions of what a heavenly community looks like from the works by philosopher and theologian Emanuel Swedenborg.

Our yearly Journey programs are open to all so do your friends a favor...invite a couple to come with you! We ourselves know that our church offers special insights but others may not be so aware. It's really up to each of us to share the secret of this gift of God's love and wisdom that we know and live by.

Dear Friends,

This last Sunday, Aug. 28, our church held our annual Potluck Picnic Sunday, returning to Creek Ridge County Park. We had a great turnout and enjoyed the blessings of the Lord's Sabbath Day together, which in part came from good visiting and fellowship within the beauty of God's creation. I'm posting pictures of the creek and some awesome clouds on our LPNC Facebook page. Isn't it amazing how enriching it is to personally connect, communicate and share a few laughs with one or more people, where the central focus of the day is on loving God and one another? When we choose to love God and one another, more of the Divine flows through us. No wonder Sabbath-keeping is including in the Lord's great Ten Commandments-it helps us feel deep healing and happiness from our Wonderful Counselor, who dwells within us all.

By the way, I do know sometimes I choose to use words with you that sometimes may seem quite "churchy" or of what we call, "church-speak." The word "Sabbath" is a good example of this. When I do, my intention is never to accidentally turn someone off. In short, I feel deeply that it is wise for me to still continue to use such words because it is part of the language of the Lord's very sacred Ten Commandments, which are the foundation of our New Church faith. This word appears in Scripture 154 times, and in Swedenborg's writings 311 times. Fascinating! With that said, I have a lot of compassion for reactions of discomfort, because many years ago I felt that way too.

Then I did some in-depth introspection,

and I discovered that I had unconsciously allowed the fundamentalist "Right" of Christianity to steal these ancient, sacred words away from me, by plastering them with speech and tones that I honestly do not feel comfortable with as a believer. Thus, I don't intend to create road blocks for anyone's mind within our congregation. As an ordained minister who pledged in my soul on my day of ordination to offer God's Word within the light of the New Evangel given through Swedenborg's mission, I promised not to alter and change core words, beliefs and terms that were providentially chosen by God to be laid down in Scripture as they are. If I water things down, then I am stealing truth away from the Lord in a spiritual sense, which I cannot

So you see, when I use the term "Sabbath," I am referring to a day or time of rest from labors and temptation battles we often face in life. Sabbath moments are spiritually centered times of innocent openness toward what is good and true, times of worship, and charity toward my neighbor. One way of looking at the heart of Sabbath time is to recognize that it's about choosing to open up and *communicate*—with God and one another. And then, the veil between the natural and spiritual worlds thins, and one can feel that Heaven has been around and within us all along.

This Fall our church will again offer a spiritual formation and growth Journey Program, which will meet at Manna House on Thursday evenings. It's title is, "Mindful Communication Challenge." The structure of this five-week program is designed to help us improve how we com-



It began with choosing paint colors (Thanks, Rev. Lisa Solwold!), then several church members and friends removed all items to the basement or the street level lift hallway. Rose Brothers Paint Company moved the pews offsite. Then Classic Plastering put a bonding agent and fabric mesh on the entire wall and ceiling area, filling and covering all crack-damaged plaster. Next a coat of new plaster material was applied.

Rose Brothers returned and latex-painted all surfaces, including the perimeter wainscoting, window trim, doors and altar. Then, carpet cleaning. By the August 21st Holy Communion service, the sanctuary was miraculously put back together again, as if not a piece of it had ever been out of place. But it is now warm and glowing with new colors of Apple Turnover and Golden Pastel. Much gratitude to God and to all others who helped make this happen.


Our sanctuary, this holy place, deeply touches the spirit of many as they feel the peaceful presence of God, within its midst, among His people, in His love and compassion. May we recognize this holy place as our gift from God.

"Why are the Americans so big?"

The Director of Missions at the Wichita First United Methodist Church shared with Pat Tukos that the translator had been asked this question when the locals saw the size of the strong Americans who came to work on a South American mission trip. The translator told them, "That is because they have always had enough food; always – from the day they were born."

Did you know that about one-third of all child deaths in the world are caused by malnutrition? Can't wrap your brain around what 1/3 means? It means that: Every day, more than 16,000 children die from hunger-related causes — about one child every 5 seconds. Upper arm circumference is one measurement of malnutrition. An average 5-year-old's upper arm is about 7 inches around. A severely malnourished child's upper arm would be less than 3 inches around. Make a circle with your finger and thumb. That's the size of a malnourished child's upper arm. Not only is being hungry miserable, but it severely affects a child's bone and brain development.

What can you do to help?



- 2. You could sponsor someone who is walking.
- 3. You could put a donation in the special bowl located in the back of the church.
- 4. You could pray for the poor and hungry.

The LaPorte County 31st Annual CROP Hunger Walk; Sunday, Sept. 25th at the Presbyterian Church of LaPorte, 307 Kingsbury Ave. Gather at 1:30 p.m. for the 5K walk at 2:00 p.m.

LaPorte and Michigan City take turns hosting the CROP Walk each year; this year it is LaPorte's turn.

CROP stands for "Communities Responding to Overcome Poverty". It is sponsored by Church World Service which works in 80 countries (including our own) by:

- Providing emergency food aid and long-term development assistance
- Developing sustainable, safe sources of drinking water
- Promoting educational opportunities for women and girls
- Supporting infant health and nutrition services

25% of the money raised in our CROP Walk is distributed to food pantries in LaPorte County. Some funds are used to assist after natural disasters in the United States and elsewhere. Others are used for such things as digging wells and buying seed and tools to help break the grip of hunger in impoverished nations.
